A **common noun** names any person, place, thing, or animal.

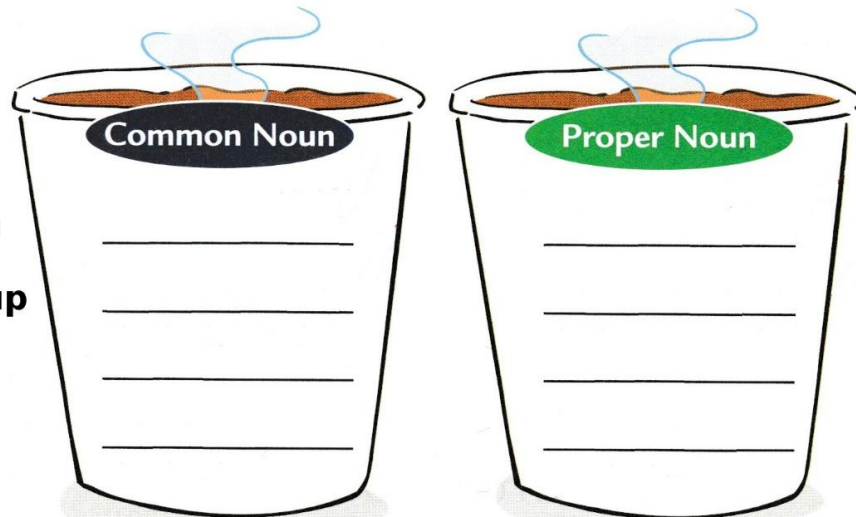
Examples: officer city coffee deer

A **proper noun** is the name for a specific person, place, thing, or animal. It always begins with a capital letter.

Examples: Gilbert Hamilton Internet Bambi

Adjectives

A **comparative adjective** compares two things. It is formed by adding "er" to or "more" before the base form.

Example: This skirt is cheaper and more beautiful than that one.

A **superlative adjective** compares three or more things. It is formed by adding "est" to or "most" before the base form.

Example: Liz is the smartest and most popular student in class.

Some comparative and superlative adjectives are irregular.
