



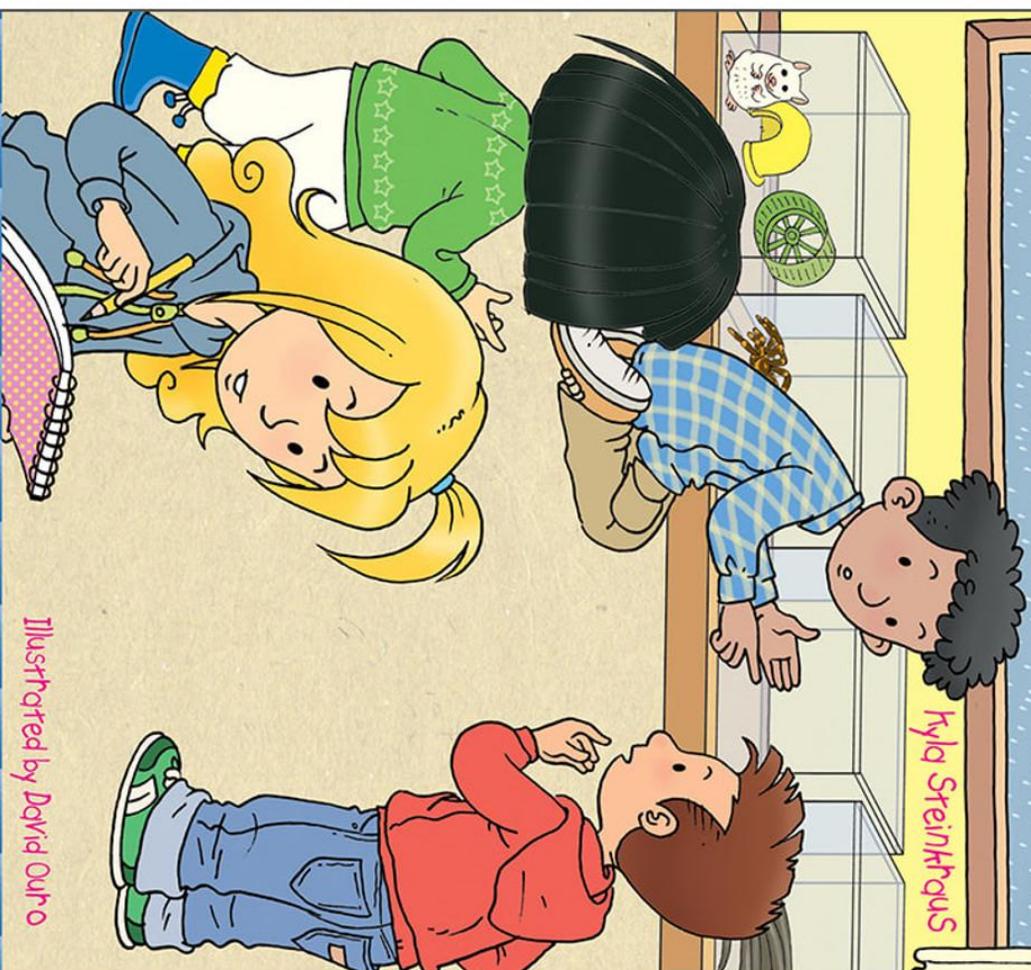

"Which reminds me," Caleb said. "How do turtles talk to each other? With their shell phones?" Rocket and Lyra giggled.


"And what do you get when you cross a turtle and a porcupine?"
